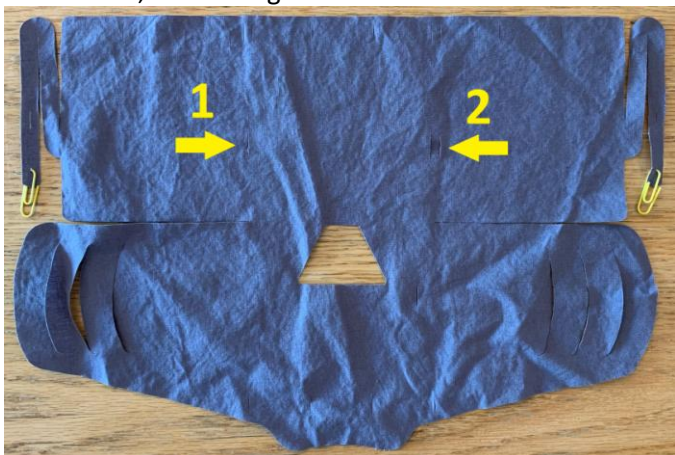


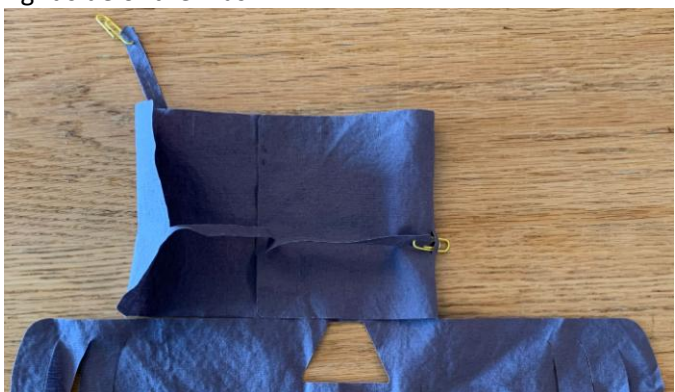
1. Start by feeding a paperclip through the small hole on the strings on the side of the mask. Notice the left side has one slit, and the right side has two slits.



2. Feed the right side string through the one slit on the left side of the mask.



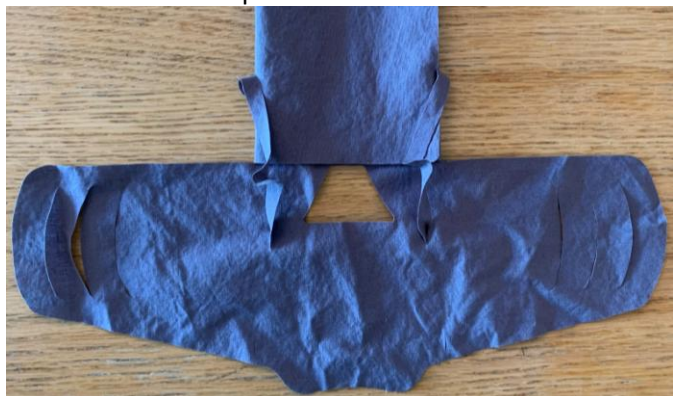
3. Feed the left side string through the two slits on the right side of the mask.



4. Pull both strings all the way through, making sure the fabric is flat.



5. Feed both strings straight down through the slits in the center of the lower portion of the mask.



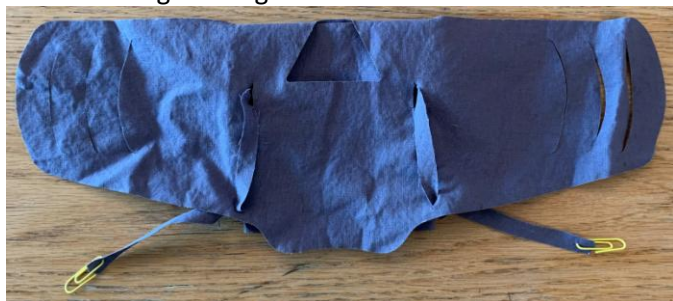
6. Pull the strings through after folding the top flap down.



7. Flip the mask over.



8. Pull the strings through the two slits at the bottom.



9. Flip the mask over again and feed both strings through each set of two slits on the lower front of the mask.



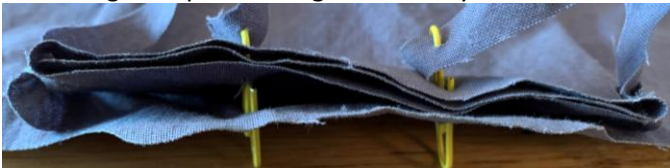
10. Pull strings all the way through.



11. Start to feed strings through the final set of slits in the center of the mask.



12. The strings will pass through all four layers of fabric.



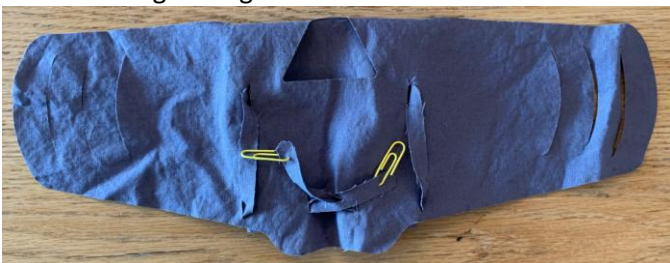
13. Flip the mask over and pull the strings the rest of the way through.



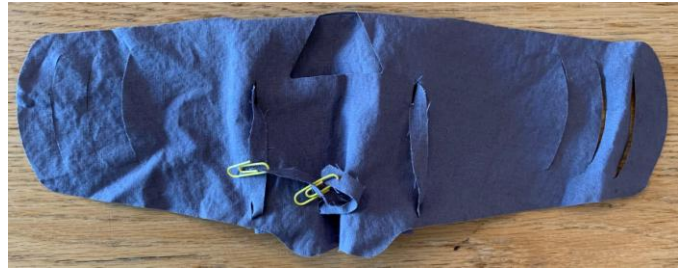
14. Insert the right string through the slit in the center of the left string.



15. Pull the string through.



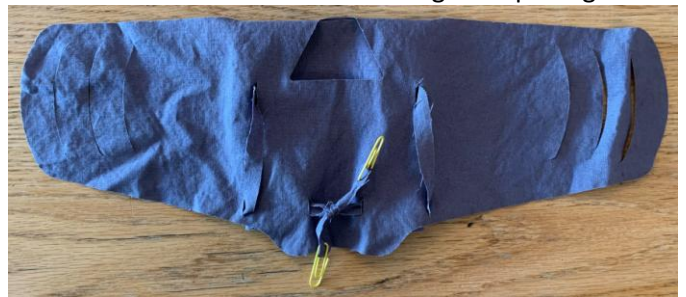
16. Pull the left side string (which is now on the right side) through the slit in the center of the right side string (which is now on the left).



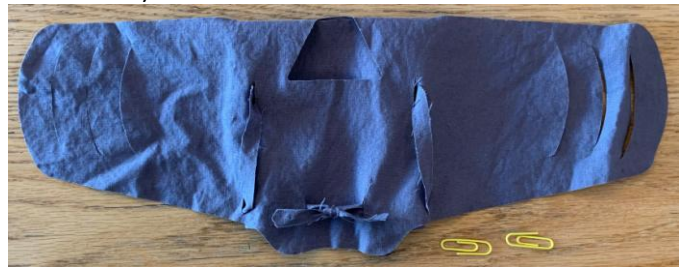
17. Pull tight.



18. Do one final knot with the two strings and pull tight.



19. Remove the paperclips. The mask is now finished! (back side shown)
